Grant/Loan Program	Program Purpose	Due Date
Grants for Tech	The grant program will pay for technology improvements for nonprofits to help make their organizations more effective and grow stronger. Eligible organizations are within the City of Dubuque including 501(c)3 nonprofits, church, school or government organizations that do not employ IT staff.	10-Sep-21
Iowa's Living Roadways Community Visioning	Iowa's Living Roadways Community Visioning is designed for communities with 10,000 residents or fewer. Through a series of planning meetings, community volunteers develop concepts for improving roadsides, entranceways and trails.	15-Sep-21

<p>Iowa Tourism Grant</p>	<p>The Iowa Tourism Grant (ITG) Program promotes tourism in Iowa by funding tourism-related marketing initiatives, meetings and events that benefit both local economies and the state's economy. Applications are available annually, and preference will be given to those that support the overall marketing plan of the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) in terms of its target audiences and messaging.</p>	<p>29-Sep-21</p>
<p>River Bluff Community Foundation (RBCF) Grant</p>	<p>The River Bluff Community Foundation offers the Impact Grant as a way of partnering with community organizations to enhance and improve the general quality of life. Grants awarded range from \$500 to \$5,000. Must be nonprofit organizations that provide services within Clinton and Camanche.</p>	<p>30-Sep-21</p>
<p>Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)</p>	<p>Funding for surface transportation alternatives projects and initiatives that are statewide or multiregional in nature and relate to transportation. Iowa's TAP program can be accessed in two ways. Statewide and multi-regional projects should apply directly to the Iowa DOT by October 1 annually for consideration in the Statewide TAP program. Access to funding for smaller, local projects is dependent on geographic location. Iowa's Transportation Management Areas (TMA), Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO), and Regional Planning Affiliations (RPA) will select local projects for funding.</p>	<p>October 1 typically but deadlines vary between funding agencies.</p>
<p>CDBG—Water/Sewer Fund</p>	<p>The program is funded through the federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The goal of this program is to provide economic opportunities for people, especially those of low- and moderate income.</p>	<p>1-Oct-21</p>
<p>Clif Bar Family Foundation</p>	<p>Clif Bar Family Foundation supports innovative small and mid-sized groups working to strengthen our food system, enhance equitable community health outcomes, enhance public health, and safeguard our environment and natural resources.</p>	<p>1-Oct-21</p>

Community Foundation of Jackson County	<p>We award grants in the priority areas of community development, diversity, education, our environment, health and human services, children, youth, families and senior citizens, arts and culture including historic preservation, and wellness projects.</p>	<p>1-Oct-21</p>
Iowa Clean Air Attainment Program (ICAAP)	<p>Funding for highway/street, transit, bicycle/pedestrian or freight projects or programs which help maintain Iowa's clean air quality by reducing transportation-related emissions. Eligible highway/street projects must be on the federal-aid system; see website for more information.</p>	<p>1-Oct-21</p>
Jones County Community Foundation	<p>Jones County Community Foundation grants to projects benefiting persons residing in Jones County, Iowa. Our priorities include economic well-being, quality of life, educational opportunities, tourism and recreation, and Jones County heritage preservation.</p>	<p>15-Oct-21</p>
Georgia-Pacific Foundation	<p>Established in 1958, the Georgia-Pacific Foundation sets aside resources to improve life in the communities where we operate. We've worked with thousands of outstanding community-based programs, service projects and disaster relief efforts, focusing our investment in four areas we believe make the most impact: education, environment, enrichment and entrepreneurship.</p>	<p>Grant requests are reviewed on a rolling cycle throughout the year. Early submission is encouraged.</p>
